Know about the Treaty of Tordesillas:
In $\frac{1493}{\text { (year) }}$ Pope Alexander VI made a decision to fairly divide South America up between Spain and Portugal. Portugal did not feel it was a fair division and so in $\frac{1494}{\text { (year) }}$ the Treaty of Tordesillas was renegotiated. An imaginary line was drawn through the South American country of Brazil. Spain received all the land west of this line and Portugal received all the land east of the line.
